The author is a realist, and maintains as his thesis that we know things as they really are. This thesis, so far as I can discover, is not supported by any affirmative argument, but is regarded as having been established in the event that the grounds which are commonly alleged for doubting the validity of knowledge can be shown to be false. The argument, therefore, pursues an indirect course, presenting as proof of its own thesis the disproof of that of its opponent There is, then, no positive analysis of the phrase, things as they really are. This concept, together with others basic to the argument, is adopted from popular and scientific thought, and is assumed to be so definite and unquestionable in meaning as to render investigation entirely superfluous. Thus the author overlooks the opportunity of making a metaphysical...
